THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY JUDGE HOGAN AT 9:00 A.M.

THE INVOCATION WAS GIVEN BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS.

THE PLEDGES OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE UNITED STATES FLAG AND  
TO THE TEXAS FLAG WERE LED BY JUDGE HOGAN.

**ITEM #1**

ROCKWALL COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE SHERRI FOWLER DISCUSSED WITH THE COURT THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO THE HISTORICAL COMMISSION. JUDGE HOGAN ASKED THE COURT TO BE PREPARED TO SUBMIT PROSPECTIVE NAMES FOR RE-APPOINTMENT AND NEW APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMISSION AT THE NEXT COMMISSIONERS COURT. THIS WAS A DISCUSSION ITEM ONLY. NO ACTION TAKEN.

**ITEM #2**

ROCKWALL COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOUNDATION AND ROCKWALL COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE SHERRI FOWLER

PRESENTATED THE COURT WITH AN OFFER BY THE FOUNDATION TO PARTNER WITH THE COURT TO PROVIDE HANDS-ON ORGANIZATIONAL AND VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE FOR THE 'TIS CHRISTMAS TIME EVENT, AN OLD FASHIONED, COUNTY-WIDE CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION. MS. FOWLER WENT ON TO SAY THAT THE FOUNDATION WOULD WORK WITH COMMISSIONER WIMPEE ON THE EVENT FOR THE CURRENT YEAR AND HOPED TO BE ALLOWED TO PLAN THE EVENT WITH COURT APPROVAL BY DECEMBER 2013. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF ACCEPTING AN OFFER FROM THE HISTORICAL FOUNDATION TO BE PARTNERS IN PLANNING THE 'TIS CHRISTMAS TIME EVENT AND TO REPORT TO THE COURT EACH JANUARY FOLLOWING THE EVENT AN EVALUATION OF THE SUCCESS OF THE EVENT.

JUDGE HOGAN INTRODUCED A GUEST SPEAKER WISHING TO ADDRESS THE COURT, YOUNG REMBRANDTS REPRESENTATIVE TRACEY MOORE. MS. MOORE ADVISED THE COURT THAT YOUNG REMBRANDTS CONSISTED OF 1<sup>ST</sup> THRU 6<sup>TH</sup> GRADE ART STUDENTS AND ASKED THE COURT TO CONSIDER ALLOWING THE GROUP TO DISPLAY THE CHILDREN'S DRAWINGS AT THE COURTHOUSE IN THE ROTUNDA AREA.

**ITEM #3**

INNOVATIVE TRANSPORTATION SOLUTIONS REPRESENTATIVE JOHN POLSTER PRESENTED THE COURT WITH SUPPLEMENTAL ROAD PROJECTS SUBMITTED BY ROCKWALL COUNTY CITIES TO BE CONSIDERED BY THE CONSORTIUM AND

ROCKWALL COUNTY AS ADDITIONS TO THE MASTER ROAD PROJECT LIST. MR. POLSTER GAVE A SYNOPSIS OF THE NEXT STEPS FOR THE ROAD PROJECTS GOING FORWARD AND A SNAPSHOT OF THE TIMETABLE FOR THE NEXT BOND ISSUANCE. THIS WAS A DISCUSSION ITEM ONLY. NO ACTION TAKEN.

**ITEMS #4 AND #5**

TATUM REPRESENTATIVE JERRY BYRD DISCUSSED WITH THE COURT THE PROPOSED AGREEMENT FROM AMCAD FOR JUDICIAL SOFTWARE IMPLEMENTATION FOR ROCKWALL COUNTY. THE COURT DISCUSSED AT LENGTH THE CONFERENCE OF URBAN COUNTIES (CUC) NEGOTIATIONS WITH AMCAD AND OTHER POTENTIAL SOFTWARE VENDORS AND POSSIBLE SAVINGS TO ROCKWALL COUNTY IF THEY WERE TO USE THE CUC FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE JUDICIAL SOFTWARE INSTEAD OF AMCAD DIRECTLY. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY JUDGE HOGAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN FOR DISCUSSION TO APPROVE THE CONTRACT PRESENTED BY TATUM FOR \$222,782.00 WITH A SPECIAL PROVISION THAT IF THE COUNTY USES THE CUC FOR THE AMCAD SOFTWARE IMPLEMENTATION THE CONTRACT WITH TATUM WILL END AFTER THEIR ANALYSIS IS COMPLETE ON THE COMPARISON OF IMPLEMENTATION OF AMCAD THRU THE CUC AND OF IMPLEMENTATION FROM AMCAD DIRECTLY. AFTER MUCH DISCUSSION THE COURT VOTED 3-2 AGAINST THE SAID MOTION WITH COMMISSIONERS WIMPEE, BAILEY AND MAGNESS VOTING AGAINST AND JUDGE HOGAN AND COMMISSIONER GRINNAN VOTING FOR. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY JUDGE

HOGAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A CONTRACT WITH TATUM NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF EVALUATING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AMCAD SOFTWARE THROUGH THE CUC AND DIRECTLY THROUGH AMCAD SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF LEGAL COUNSEL AND THE AUDITOR.

**ITEM #6**

COMMISSIONER BAILEY UPDATED THE COURT ON THE CURRENT REGIONAL HEALTH PARTNERSHIP (RHP) ISSUES AND ANNOUNCED THE PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 23<sup>RD</sup> AT 9:00 A.M. JUDGE HOGAN EXPLAINED THE 1115 WAIVER TO IMPROVE HEALTH CARE TO THE UNINSURED AND UNDERINSURED. THIS WAS A DISCUSSION ITEM ONLY. NO ACTION TAKEN.

**ITEM #7**

COMMISSIONER BAILEY BRIEFLY DISCUSSED WITH THE COURT LEGISLATION RELATING TO AN ADDITIONAL FEE FOR FILING CIVIL CASES IN CERTAIN ROCKWALL COUNTY COURTS AND REQUESTED THAT THE COURT START ASSEMBLING A LIST OF LEGISLATIVE ISSUES OF CONCERN TO ROCKWALL COUNTY TO BE PRESENTED TO THE COUNTY'S LEGISLATORS.

**ITEM #8**

JUDGE HOGAN DISCUSSED WITH THE COURT THE PUBLIC DEFENDER OFFICE PROGRAM FOR CAPITAL CASES AND ADVISED THE COURT THAT RESEARCH SHOWS CUSTOMARY COSTS INCURRED IN A CAPITAL CASE DIDN'T JUSTIFY

THE COSTS OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER PROGRAM. ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY JON THATCHER STATED TO THE COURT THAT NO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT HAD BEEN APPROVED TO DATE FOR THE COURT'S CONSIDERATION. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF NOT APPROVING THE TEXAS REGIONAL PUBLIC DEFENDER OFFICE PROGRAM FOR CAPITAL CASES.

**ITEM #9**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY JUDGE HOGAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF A 34 FOOT, NATURAL BRANCH CHRISTMAS TREE WITH A 6 FOOT STAR AND 2,360 LED BULBS FROM HOLIDAY DESIGNS, INC. AT A COST OF \$17,500.00 TO BE PAID FROM THE CONTINGENCY FUND.

**ITEM #10**

COMMISSIONER MAGNESS DISCUSSED WITH THE COURT ADDITIONAL STORAGE SPACE REQUESTED AT THE COUNTY SERVICES BUILDING. AFTER DISCUSSION COMMISSIONER MAGNESS STATED THAT HE WOULD OBTAIN COMPETITIVE BIDS AND BRING THEM BACK TO THE COURT ALONG WITH A LAYOUT OF THE FLOORPLANS. THIS WAS A DISCUSSION ITEM ONLY. NO ACTION TAKEN.

**ITEM #11**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF

APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH ROYSE CITY FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS ON AN AS NEEDED BASIS BY THE ROCKWALL COUNTY ROAD AND BRIDGE DEPARTMENT TO CIRCLE LANE/DRIVE, FLOYD ROAD, SORRELS ROAD AND ELM GROVE AT AN AGREED UPON COST AND AVAILABLE SCHEDULE.

**ITEM #12**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A PROPOSAL FROM THE ROCKWALL COUNTY ROAD AND BRIDGE ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS NEEDED FOR THE ASPHALT IMPROVEMENT OF CIRCLE DRIVE IN ROYSE CITY AS REQUESTED, AND TO BE PAID BY THE CITY AT A COST OF \$81,852.00.

**ITEM #13**

THIS ITEM REGARDING THE REVISED FY2013 MEMBERSHIP WITH DALLAS REGIONAL MOBILITY COALITION WAS PULLED FROM THE AGENDA. NO ACTION NEEDED AT THIS TIME.

**ITEM #14**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A PROPOSAL FROM THYSSENKRUPP FOR THE ANNUAL QEI STATE INSPECTION OF THE ELEVATORS LOCATED IN THE COURTHOUSE AT A COST OF \$2,975.00.

## **ITEM #15**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE FOR DISCUSSION TO AWARD A CONTRACT TO CHANEY PAPER PRODUCTS FOR CLEANING SUPPLIES AND PAPER PRODUCTS FOR ROCKWALL COUNTY FOR FY2013. COMMISSIONER GRINNAN STATED FOR THE RECORD THAT SHE FOUND THE ISSUE MOST TROUBLESOME AND EXPRESSED HER OBJECTION TO AWARDED A CONTRACT TO A SOON TO BE ELECTED OFFICIAL'S COMPANY AND THAT THE ITEM INVOLVED APPROXIMATELY \$55,000.00 WORTH OF BUSINESS FOR COMMON PRODUCTS THAT COULD BE FOUND FROM ANOTHER SOURCE. COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WENT ON TO SAY THAT ALTHOUGH NOT ILLEGAL, IT WAS CERTAINLY UNETHICAL AND A POLICY WAS NEEDED THAT PROHIBITS A FUTURE COURT FROM ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT WITH AN ELECTED OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE TO PUT AN END TO THE NEGATIVE PERCEPTION THIS PRESENTS. COMMISSIONER MAGNESS COMMENTED THAT HE STRONGLY DISAGREED THAT IT WAS UNETHICAL AND STATED THAT IT WAS A FAIR BID, THAT THE BIDDING PROCESS HAD BEEN DONE PROPERLY AND THE PRACTICE HAD BEEN APPROVED BY BOTH THE LEGISLATURE AND THE TEXAS ETHICS COMMISSION. AFTER MUCH DISCUSSION THE COURT VOTED 3-2 IN FAVOR OF THE SAID MOTION WITH COMMISSIONER GRINNAN AND JUDGE HOGAN VOTING AGAINST.

**ITEM #16**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF ADVERTISING BY PUBLIC NOTICE FOR BIDS ON CEMENT TREATED MATERIAL SUPER SLURRY FOR THE ROAD & BRIDGE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 26.023.

**ITEM #17**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF ADOPTING A SPECIAL BUDGET OF GRANT MONEY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00 FROM THE STATE COMPTROLLER PURSUANT TO SECTION 111.0106 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE.

**ITEM #18**

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE TO APPROVE A ONE-YEAR RESOLUTION WITH THE ROCKWALL COUNTY COMMITTEE ON AGING TO CONTINUE PROVIDING HOME-DELIVERED MEAL SERVICES FOR HOMEBOUND PERSONS IN THE COUNTY WHO ARE ELDERLY AND/OR HAVE A DISABILITY, EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2012 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000.00. COMMITTEE ON AGING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MARGIE VANHAGAN EXPLAINED TO THE COURT THAT THE RESOLUTION WAS NEEDED TO ENABLE THE COMMITTEE ON AGING TO BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A GRANT FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE. COMMISSIONER MAGNESS AMENDED HIS MOTION TO APPROVE THE

RESOLUTION AS PRESENTED WITH THE ADDENDUM TO REQUIRE A LETTER TO BE WRITTEN BY LEGAL COUNSEL FROM THE COUNTY TO THE COMMITTEE ON AGING ACKNOWLEDGING WHAT THE MONEY IS TO BE USED FOR, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF THE SAID AMENDED MOTION.

COMMISSIONER MAGNESS RECOMMENDED THAT THIS ITEM REGARDING THE FY2013 MEMBERSHIP WITH TEX-21 BE PULLED. NO ACTION TAKEN.
