ITEM #1

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF ACCEPTING THE RESIGNATION OF COUNTY AGENT EMILY NICHOLS. THE COURT WISHED MS. NICHOLS THE BEST AND THANKED HER FOR HER SERVICE TO THE COUNTY.

THIS ITEM REGARDING APPROVING A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CITY OF ROCKWALL'S REQUEST THAT THE STATE OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION RELEASE OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL OF FM-549 FROM THE SOUTH RIGHT OF WAY OF INTERSTATE 30 TO THE NORTH RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF SH-276 TO THE CITY OF ROCKWALL WAS SET ASIDE TO DISCUSS DURING THE WORKSHOP.

ITEM #3

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING THE ROCKWALL COUNTY 9-1-1 ADDRESSING STANDARDS GUIDE AS REQUESTED BY NORTH TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENT (NCTCOG).

THE SALARY LEVEL WILL BE SET AS DETAILED IN THE PRESENTED PLAN RECOMMENDED BY THE HUMAN RESOURCE DIRECTOR RANDY JENNINGS AND WOULD ALLOW THE DETENTION

CENTER THE FLEXIBILITY OF FILLING A CURRENT JAIL NURSE LVN JOB OPENING WITH A MEDICAL TECH OR SENIOR MEDICAL TECH.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF

RENEWING THE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES CONTRACT WITH INNOVATIVE TRANSPORTATION SOLUTIONS, INC. TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL CONSULTING SERVICES FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2009 AT AN ANNUAL FEE OF \$120,000.00.

ITEM #10

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY JUDGE FLORANCE WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF CONTINUING THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH KAUFMAN AREA RURAL TRANSIT (KART) FOR AN ADDITIONAL ONE YEAR TERM (YEAR 2 OF 3) EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2009 AT A CONTRIBUTION OF \$10,000.00.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF RENEWING AN ADDENDUM TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH LIMESTONE COUNTY FOR HOUSING ROCKWALL COUNTY INMATES, IF NEEDED, EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2009 AT A COST OF \$44.00 PER DAY PER INMATE.

ITEM #12

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN TO APPROVE A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR THE PURCHASE OF EIGHT (8) MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS FOR THE COUNTY SHERIFF'S PATROL CARS IN AMOUNT OR \$25,216.00. AFTER DISCUSSION REGARDING THE

CONDITIONS TO APPLY FOR THE GRANT, COMMISSIONER GRINNAN RESCINDED HER SECOND AND COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITHDREW HIS MOTION. THE COURT WILL DISCUSS THIS TOPIC AS A BUDGET ITEM DURING THE WORKSHOP. THE COURT MAY DECIDE TO EITHER BUDGET THE MONEY THEMSELVES FROM THE COUNTY BUDGET AND NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE GRANT OR TO ALLOW THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE TO APPLY FOR THE GRANT. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR JOE DELANE SPECIFIED THAT THIS GRANT IS A CONDITION FOR FUTURE GRANTS AND THAT TODAY'S DATE WAS THE FINAL DATE FOR ACCEPTANCE AND THE DEADLINE FOR THE GRANT.

ITEM #13

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A 15-MONTH MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT WITH 3M FOR THE RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM AT THE COUNTY LIBRARY EFFECTIVE JULY 17, 2009 AT A COST OF \$7,149.84.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE (FOR DISCUSSION) WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF RENEWING A ONE-YEAR INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH ROYSE CITY FOR THE COUNTY TO CONTINUE PROVIDING GUIDANCE, TRAINING, ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT FOR A ROYSE CITY LIBRARY EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2009.

CRIMINAL DISTRICT ATTORNEY KENDA CULPEPPER EXPLAINED THE NEED FOR THESE AGREEMENT WHICH WOULD ALLOW A MUNICIPAL JUDGE TO ISSUE A WARRANT TO OBTAIN BLOOD SAMPLES FROM INDIVIDUALS SUSPECTED OF DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED AND ARE REFUSING TO TAKE A BREATHALYZER TEST. MS. CULPEPPER ADVISED THAT THE FUNDING COULD NOT BE CHARGED TO THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S BUDGET OR THE LAW ENFORCEMENT'S BUDGET. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN TO APPROVE BOTH INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENTS WITH THE CITIES OF ROCKWALL AND ROWLETT REGARDING MUNICIPAL JUDGE SERVICES FOR LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT A MAXIMUM COST OF \$2,500.00 EACH WITH THE FUNDING TO BE TAKEN OUT OF THE COMMISSIONERS COURT BUDGET. COUNTY AUDITOR JOHN BLACKWOOD REQUESTED THAT THE COURT GIVE THE AUDITOR PERMISSION TO REVIEW AND TO DECIDE WHERE THE MONEY WILL BE CHARGED. COMMISSIONER WIMPEE WITHDREW HIS MOTION AND COMMISSIONER GRINNAN RESCINDED HER SECOND. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING BOTH INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENTS WITH THE CITIES OF ROCKWALL AND ROWLETT REGARDING MUNICIPAL JUDGE SERVICES FOR LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT A MAXIMUM COST OF \$2,500.00

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING SETTING ASIDE THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY DISPOSITION TO THE NEXT AGENDA:

B. Fire Marshal transfer to County Sheriff-CID: 2005 Ford Expedition including all addon equipment.

COMMISSIONER MAGNESS ADDED THAT THE FIXTURE AND EQUIPMENT PURCHASES SHOULD INCLUDE NEW CARPETING OR PATCHING/REPAIRING THE EXISTING CARPETING IN THE NEW COURTROOM ON FANNIN STREET AND THE PURCHASE OF A TASER FOR COURTROOM SECURITY. COMMISSIONER BAILEY SPECIFIED THAT HIS MOTION DID NOT INCLUDE STANDARDS AS TO THE CERTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR THE USE OF TASER THEREFORE JUDGE FLORANCE WITHDREW HIS SECOND. THERE WAS NO FURTHER SECOND THEREFORE THE MOTION DIED FOR A LACK OF A SECOND. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY ACQUISITION:

A. Justice of the Peace Pct. 1 to purchase from General Fund: Furniture, fixtures and equipment for new JP Courtroom from various vendors @ a total cost up to \$5,600.00 excluding the taser.

**JUDGE FLORANCE RE-OPENED THE REGULAR MEETING AT 3:23PM.

ITEM #12- RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR THE PURCHASE OF EIGHT (8) MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS FOR THE COUNTY SHERIFF'S PATROL CARS IN AMOUNT OR \$25,216.00. JUDGE FLORANCE SPECIFIED THAT THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE WOULD SIGN FOR THIS GRANT APPLICATION.

**JUDGE FLORANCE RECESSED THE MEETING AT 3:24PM TO RETURN TO THE WORKSHOP. AT 3:50PM, JUDGE FLORANCE RE-OPENED THE MEETING.

ITEM #2 –RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 4-1 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE CITY OF ROCKWALL'S REQUEST THAT THE STATE OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION RELEASE OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL OF FM-549 FROM THE SOUTH RIGHT OF WAY OF INTERSTATE 30 TO THE NORTH RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF SH-276 TO THE CITY OF ROCKWALL AND

RENAME THE ROAD AS FM3549. MINOR CORRECTIONS HAVE BEEN MADE TO THE RESOLUTION THAT STIPULATES THE CITY WILL ASSIST TXDOT WITH PUBLIC OUTREACH AND NOT THE COUNTY. COMMISSIONER GRINNAN STATED THAT THIS DECISION BY THE COURT DOES NOT ENDORSE NOR SUPPORT THE CITY OF ROCKWALL'S ACTIONS PERTAINING TO FM-549, COMMISSIONER WIMPEE VOTED AGAINST.

ITEM #6 – RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 4-1 IN FAVOR OF ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AT A COST OF \$9,500 WITH ALLISON BASS AND ASSOCIATES TO IMPLEMENT HB2462, GENERALLY KNOWN AS HB1117 COUNTY ROAD MAP STATUTE WITH THE CONTRACT TO BE APPROVED BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE AND THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, JUDGE FLORANCE VOTED AGAINST.

ITEM #7 – RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY JUDGE FLORANCE WITH THE COURT VOTING 2-3 TO NOT JOIN TEX-21, COMMISSIONERS MAGNESS, GRINNAN AND BAILEY VOTED AGAINST. THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BAILEY WITH THE COURT VOTING 3-2 IN FAVOR OF JOINING A ONE-YEAR (2010) TEX-21 MEMBERSHIP AT A COST OF \$4,250.

ITEM #8 – RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MAGNESS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN WITH THE COURT VOTING 4-1 IN FAVOR OF ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH HILL & WILKINSON TO RENOVATE THE COUNTY SERVICES BUILDING AS DESCRIBED IN THE SCOPE OF WORK PRESENTED BY GILBERT CONSTRUCTION SERVICES AT A COST OF \$241,500.00 TO BE PAID IN A LUMP SUM, WITH \$5,000 TO BE USED FOR MISCELLANEOUS EXPENSES. THE \$5,000 WILL BE RETURNED TO THE COUNTY IF NOT NEEDED. THE APPROVAL OF THE AGREEMENT BROUGHT BY HILL & WILKINSON IS CONTINGENT UPON COUNTY AUDITOR AND DISTRICT ATTORNEY OFFICE APPROVAL, JUDGE FLORANCE VOTED AGAINST.

ITEM #20 – RE-ADDRESSED:

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE, BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF JUDGE KARR, JUSTICE OF THE PEACE PRECINCT 1, FOR A TASER TO BE USED IN THE JUSTICE OF PEACE COURTROOM. CONDITIONS WILL APPLY: THE TASER WILL REMAIN IN THE COURTROOM AND NON-COMPLIANCE BY THE USER OF THE TASER WILL RESULT IN THE RETRIEVAL TO THE TASER. COMMISSIONER GRINNAN RESCINDED HER MOTION AND COMMISSIONER WIMPEE WITHDREW HIS SECOND TO FIRST RESCIND PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN ON THIS ITEM.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE, SECONDED BY JUDGE FLORANCE WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 TO RESCIND THE ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN ON ITEM #20A REGARDING THE PROPERTY ACQUISITION FOR THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURTROOM.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GRINNAN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WIMPEE WITH THE COURT VOTING 5-0 IN FAVOR OF APPROVING:

- A. Justice of the Peace Pct. 1 to purchase from General Fund: Furniture, fixtures and equipment for new JP Courtroom from various vendors up to the amount of \$6,000, including a taser, which was recommended by Judge Karr for his courtroom. The use of the taser will have the following conditions: the taser will remain in the courtroom, Judge Karr will be responsible for the use of the taser by certified users only and non-compliance of these conditions will result in the loss of the taser. The purchase of the taser will be paid from the Courthouse Security Fund. The maintenance department will patch the carpeting with money from the maintenance departments budget.

ITEM #7 – RE-ADDRESSED:
