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#### SLIDE 3 - Public Meeting Purpose


This Public Meeting is being held by Rockwall County to receive and consider comments from the public regarding the Rockwall County Outer Loop Project.

You may have attended previous public meetings. However, for the benefit of those who have never attended one, I will explain why and how a public meeting is conducted.

This Public Meeting has four essential purposes:


- 1. To inform the public of the project status.
- 2. To describe the project to the public so the public can determine how they may be affected.
- 3. To provide the public an opportunity to view information and express their ideas and concerns at this stage in the planning process while the ability to respond to comments is still flexible and before location and design decisions are finalized.
- 4. And finally, to develop a record of public participation to accompany recommendations for project decision making.

This Public Meeting is being held in compliance with both federal and state laws. Documentation of this meeting will be made available for the official record.



#### SLIDE 4 - Project History

The concept for the Rockwall County Outer Loop began in 2002 under an initiative from the governor of Texas. Rockwall County developed a routing study in 2005 which resulted in a preliminary roadway corridor that was integrated in the North Central Texas Council of Government's, or NCTCOG's, long-range mobility plan in 2007. Four years later, the NCTCOG conducted a feasibility study over 12 counties to identify a regional outer loop around the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. In that feasibility study, the Rockwall County Outer Loop was identified as a segment of independent utility for continued development and further evaluation. This project is an extension of the previous work done by Rockwall County and the NCTCOG to identify, refine, and study potential alignments to advance to a design and environmental study phase. The feasibility study phase of the project was concluded following the November 2023 Public Meeting.



#### SLIDE 5 - Regional Outer Loop

The Rockwall County Outer Loop Project is part of the regional outer loop studied in the 2011 NCTCOG Regional Outer Loop Feasibility Study. Continuity with other segments of the regional outer loop is part of the Rockwall County Outer Loop Project's purpose and need, described on the next slide.

Each counties' portion of the regional outer loop is in different stages of study, planning, or development. For more information on other portions of the eastern regional outer loop, please see the project websites referenced on this slide.



## **Project Need and Purpose**

#### Need:

The proposed project is needed because there is a lack of north-south connectivity and roadway capacity within Rockwall County to meet local and regional mobility needs and accommodate projected vehicular traffic volume increases on the local roadway network resulting from anticipated development and population growth. A new location roadway is needed within the study area due to the lack of suitable, continuous north-south major arterials.

#### Purpose:

The purpose of the proposed project is to improve north-south connectivity and mobility at the local and regional level and accommodate population and traffic volume growth by providing a new roadway that would connect to existing highways and the planned Outer Loop in Collin and Kaufman counties.



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
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#### SLIDE 7 – Previous Public Involvement


A feasibility study was conducted for the Rockwall County Outer Loop, which included two public meetings, one in November 2022 and one in November 2023. An alternative recommended for further study was presented at the November 2023 Public Meeting.

## SLIDE 8 – Project Description

The proposed project would construct the Rockwall County portion of the regional Outer Loop, from FM 2755 to SH 205, a distance of approximately 14.4 miles in Collin, Rockwall, and Kaufman Counties, Texas.



## SLIDE 9 - Project Phase One and Phase Two

The proposed Rockwall County Outer Loop is currently being developed in two phases. Phase 1 extends from FM 2755 to SH 276, a distance of approximately 7.5 miles. Phase 2 extends from SH 276 to SH 205, a distance of approximately 6.9 miles. Phase 1 schematic development and environmental studies are currently underway. No project updates have occurred on Phase 2 since the November 2023 Public Meeting. Phase 2 schematic development and environmental studies are anticipated to begin by Spring 2025.



#### SLIDE 10 - Proposed Typical Sections


The project would be constructed in stages that are contingent on traffic volumes and available funding.

Stage 1 would construct one frontage road with two lanes, one in each direction, and one shared use path.

Stage 2 would add the other side of the paired frontage road for a total of four frontage road lanes, two lanes in each direction, and two shared use paths. Each frontage road would be converted to one-way operation. The median would be left open for future stages.

Stage 3, the ultimate proposed project configuration, would include the addition of a four-lane access-controlled highway, two main lanes in each direction between the frontage roads. The remaining median would be left open to allow space for future transportation-related developments to be studied separately. The proposed project would also include two shared-use bicycle and pedestrian paths with one on the outside of each frontage road.

The proposed typical 500-foot-wide right-of-way for all stages would be acquired according to applicable policies and procedures prior to Stage 1.



## SLIDE 11 - Project Timeline and Next Steps

An approved Phase 1 schematic and draft environmental assessment, or EA, are expected to be completed in summer of 2025, followed by a public hearing and then environmental clearance in late 2025 to early 2026. Phase 2 schematic and environmental studies will be prepared separately and are anticipated to begin in spring 2025.

After environmental clearance, funding will be identified, right-ofway acquisition and utility relocation processes will begin, and construction will occur.



## National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Assignment to the Texas Department of Transportation

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by TxDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated December 9, 2019, and executed by FHWA and TxDOT.

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# <u>SLIDE 12 - National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Assignment to the Texas Department of Transportation</u>

Prior to December 16, 2014, the Federal Highway Administration, or FHWA, received and approved documents prepared under the National Environmental Policy Act, known as NEPA; however, on December 14, 2014, the Texas Department of Transportation, or TxDOT, assumed responsibility from FHWA through a Memorandum of Understanding to review and approve certain assigned NEPA environmental documents. This Memorandum of Understanding between TxDOT and FHWA was updated on December 9, 2019. The review and approval process apply to this project. Environmental studies will be conducted for the Rockwall County Outer Loop Project to support an environmental clearance in accordance with NEPA. These environmental analyses are necessary to identify, avoid, and minimize effects to the Human and Natural Environments.

Notices for this Public Meeting were advertised in Spanish in *Al Día*, and in English in the *McKinney Courier-Gazette, Rockwall County Herald-Banner, Royse City Herald-Banner, Dallas Morning News*, and on TxDOT Dallas District's keepitmovingdallas.com under "Public Hearings/Meetings." Notice of the Public Meeting was mailed to study area property owners, elected and public officials, project stakeholders, and previous public meeting participants.
