






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#### About the Public Engagement Events

A series of in-person and online engagement events were held for the Rockwall County Strategic Plan 2050. The County hosted six in-person public forums from May 14, 2024 to June 27, 2024 at the Rockwall County Courthouse. Each public forum began with a brief presentation on the project and the discussion topic, then participants provided their comments on the interactive boards. Approximately 330 people attended the in-person public forums.

- May 14, 2024: Economic Development
- May 23, 2024: Regional & Community Design, Transportation & Mobility, and Housing & Infrastructure
- June 4, 2024: Environmental Factors & Sustainability, Land Use & Open Spaces, and Historical Preservation
- June 11, 2024: Education and Non-Profit Organizations
- June 20, 2024: Public Safety and Public Health
- June 27, 2024: Community Facilities & Services, and Leisure & Activity

An online alternative was made available between April 30, 2024 to July 3, 2024 at <a href="https://www.rockwallcountytexas.com/strategicplan">https://www.rockwallcountytexas.com/strategicplan</a>. Approximately 550 people participated in the online engagement activities, contributing over 11,000 responses. This input packet documents the input received during both the in-person and online engagement events. 



Figure 2 Engagement Questions, May 23, 2024






Figure 4 Engagement Questions, June 11, 2024




Figure 5 Engagement Questions, June 20, 2024




Figure 6 Engagement Questions, June 27, 2024






Figure 7. Engagement Questions, May 14, 2024








Figure 10 Engagement Questions, June 11, 2024




Figure 11 Engagement Questions, June 20, 2024





Figure 12 Engagement Questions, June 27, 2024







Figure 14 Economic Development, May 14, 2024






Figure 18 Regional & Community Design, May 23, 2024









Figure 21 Transportation & Mobility, May 23, 2024









Figure 23 Transportation & Mobility, May 23, 2024










Figure 27 Environmental Factors & Sustainability, June 4, 2024




Figure 28 Environmental Factors & Sustainability, June 4, 2024




Figure 29 Environmental Factors & Sustainability, June 4, 2024




Figure 30 Land Use & Open Spaces, June 4, 2024




Figure 31 Land Use & Open Spaces, June 4, 2024








Figure 32 Land Use & Open Spaces, June 4, 2024




Figure 37 Education Components, June 11, 2024






Figure 38 Education Components, June 11, 2024




Figure 39 Education Components, June 11, 2024








Figure 40 Non-Profit Organizations, June 11, 2024







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


Figure 47 Public Health, June 20, 2024




Figure 48 Community Facilities & Services, June 27, 2024
